APRIL IS SAFE DIGGING MONTH

(811) Call Before you Dig

Many of us look forward to getting out in the yard this spring and summer, but we urge you to take caution before digging too deep. Accidentally cutting into utility lines is not only expensive, but can be deadly. Iowa law requires anyone who does digging or excavating to call Iowa One Call to see if there are any underground utility lines or cables. This applies to homeowners planting trees or fence posts and commercial contractors excavating for buildings.









It is important to call at least 48 hours before you are set to dig. If underground lines exist in that area, the utilities will mark the location of the lines within that 48 hour period.

Iowa One Call will request detailed information including the type of work planned, location of site, estimated time needed and a contact person with phone number.

Iowa One Call will fax the information to Denison area utilities and they will go to the site and flag or paint where their lines are located. Pictured here is a chart that shows the colors of the utilities.

Customers should take the following steps to prepare themselves, their families and their homes this spring storm season:

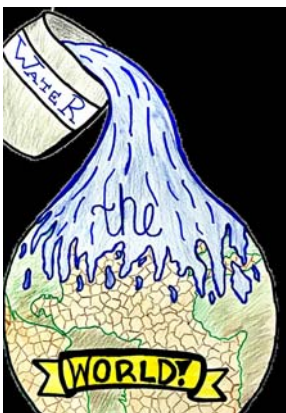
- Make a **disaster plan** and make sure everyone knows where to go in case of a tornado or other weather-related emergency.
- Assemble a **disaster kit** for your home and cars that contains a first aid kit, canned food, can opener, bottled water, battery-operated radio, flashlight, protective clothing, and written instructions on how to turn off the electricity, gas, and water.
- After a storm has moved out of your area, make sure everyone knows to **stay away from fallen power lines**. If lines are on the ground, they may be energized and deadly. Contact DMU immediately to report a downed power line.

DMU TO CELEBRATE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL SAFETY MONTH

May is National Electrical Safety Month and Denison Municipal Utilities (DMU) is joining with the Electrical Safety Foundation International (ESFI) to raise awareness and promote electrical safety in the home, school and workplace. On average, 325 people die and 4,400 are injured each year because of electrical hazards, according to data published by the National Safety Council. Electricity is also the cause of over 140,000 fires resulting in \$1.6 billion in property damage each year.

The leading cause of fatal electrical incidents while on the job is contact with power lines, both above and below ground. Eliminating electrical hazards begins with education and awareness. Listed are some electrical safety tips to help avoid tragic and costly injuries:

- Use appliances and equipment according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Replace damaged electrical equipment or have it repaired at an authorized repair center.
- Make sure power strips, cords and surge suppressors are designed to handle the loads for their intended use.
- Avoid overloading circuits by plugging in too many items into the same outlet.
- Use ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protection when working where water is near electricity to protect against electric shock.
- Make certain that all products and equipment are Underwriters Laboratories (UL) approved.
- Avoid contact with power lines by being aware of the location of power lines and keeping a distance of at least 10 feet between you and power lines to avoid arcs.

Electrical safety awareness and education among consumers, families, employees and communities will prevent electrical fires, injuries and fatalities. A focus on electrical safety, both at home and in the workplace, can prevent the hundreds of deaths, thousands of injuries and billions of dollars in economic losses that occur each year because of electrical hazards.
